ADMISSION POLICY

Admission procedures for the academic year 2025–26 were completed successfully in accordance with the guidelines issued in the official admission circular. *Balvatika* III was introduced, as per NEP 2020 regulations, and a total of 42 students were admitted to this new section.

For Class I, admission was granted to 29 students, while 10 students were admitted across Classes II to VIII. In Class XI, 54 students were enrolled this year.

CBSE BOARD EXAMINATION

VSSC Central School has hosted and successfully conducted the CBSE Secondary/Sr. Secondary examination 2025 .

NEP (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY)& ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

According to the NEP , the age criterion for Class 1 admission is 6 years.

NEP emphasises the use of native languages for teaching, suggesting the use of the mother tongue until at least Grade 5 and preferably until Grade 8 to facilitate easy learning. Students are encouraged to take part in various activities corresponding to the ‘Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat’ initiative.

Orientation sessions for parents, School Readiness Activities, Vidya Pravesh, Entry Level Assessment (ELA), Mid Year Assessment (MYA), and Year End Assessment (YEA) were done through a series of interesting activities .Informal Assessment for classes 1 and 2 are being conducted. The Holistic development of a child is given priority, taking into consideration the Health and well-being of the students, developing Effective Communication Skills, and making them Involved Learners rather than rote learners. Thus, the 3 Learning outcomes of FLN are taken care of.

The first and third Saturdays have been implemented as Fundays for the Primary Children incorporating activity-based fun learning modules which are often interdisciplinary. A separate timetable for the same is also available.

SAFAL exams were conducted for classes 6 and 9 to assess the students' progress in Science, Maths, and English Language. Parameters like Conceptual Clarity, analytical skills, application of knowledge in real life, etc., were assessed.

New textbooks for classes 7 and 8 were introduced through bridge courses, facilitating a seamless transition for students to new pedagogical practices and areas of study aligned with the new curriculum framework.

Introduction of skill subjects like AI, Handicraft, Satellites and their Applications and What to do when Dr. is not around have been introduced for classes 6-8.

The 360-degree Holistic Progress Cards have been issued to the students at the Preparatory level.

Our school has a Counsellor who caters to the emotional and academic needs of the students by way of one-to-one counselling. The counsellor is available on all Mondays and Wednesdays.

As per the NEP guidelines, no child should lose any opportunity to learn and excel because of the circumstances of birth or background. Divyang children are also enabled to fully participate in the regular schooling process in our school.

Introduction of Competency-based questions for assessment through worksheets, sample papers, and activity-oriented teaching.

THE PTA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee presently consists of 23 members. Shri. Sunil Kumar R is the General Secretary, and Smt.Nancy Ninan is serving as the Joint Secretary of the PTA 2024- 2026. The Principal is the ex officio Chairperson of the PTA. The School Annual General Meeting was conducted on 31/05/2025 in the school auditorium.

Around 100 parents from classes 1 -12 attended the meeting and shared their aspirations and thoughts about the school. The PTA Election/Selection for classes 1,3,7and 11 was conducted on 05/08/2025 and simultaneously new members were selected for all these classes except class 3.

COUNSELLING & CAREER GUIDANCE SESSIONS

Various sessions on stress management, anger management, Consent formation, behavioural challenges, Neuro-Cognitive Enhancement, Aptitude Test,Sugar Consumption and Diabetes in Children: Supporting Mental Well-being Together, etc were held in the School Library. Students participated in a colloquium, Living in Space –A Gaganyaathri's perspective,which was organised by VSSC on 8th October 2025.The speaker of the session was Group Captain Prasanth Balakrishnan, Gaganyaatri designate.

Mental Health Week was celebrated from 4th -10th October 2025 and a series of activities were conducted.

LIBRARY REPORT DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

VSSC Central School Library is automated using the library software named LIBSOFT Version 4.1. We can access the Library Catalogue (OPAC-Online Public Access Catalogue) through the Internet. A series of informative and engaging activities like Book Reviews, National Reading Day Celebrations, Book exhibitions, etc. were organised throughout the academic year to promote reading, environmental awareness, and appreciation for knowledge acquisition.

SPORTS AND GAMES

At the Trivandrum District Yoga competition, the school won a silver medal, and the students became eligible to participate in the Kerala State Level Yoga competition, which was held at Kannur.

Our School Football team and Table Tennis team participated in the CBSE State Level Competition held at Kollam.

In the South Zone Sahodaya Swimming Competition, the school won a Silver medal in 100 mts Backstroke and a Bronze Medal in 50mts Breast Stroke.

In the SZSC Badminton Tournament, the school secured a Gold Medal in Singles, and a Silver medal in Senior Mixed Doubles. In the Sub Junior Girls Singles, our school won the Bronze Medal, and in the Sub Junior Mixed Doubles category, the school won the Bronze Medal.

In the SZSC, our school won 3 gold medals, 4 silver medals and 6 Bronze medals.

The CBSE State Level Badminton Tournament was held at Kochi. Our school won the Bronze Medal.

In the CBSE State Level Athletic Meet, the school won a Gold Medal in the Discus Throw, Silver medal in 400 mts and Bronze Medal in 600 mts. The students qualified to participate in the CBSE National Athletic Meet held at Varanasi.

In the District Athletic Meet, the school won 2 Gold medals, 2 Silver medals and 4 Bronze medals.

In the Kerala Central School Sports Meet , our school won 2 gold medals, 3 Silver medals and 5 Bronze medals.

The 43rd Annual Sports Day was held on 2nd December 2025 at VSSC Central School ground. Shri. Suraj S, SCI/ENG-G, Group Director, PSCG, was the Chief Guest for the Opening Ceremony and Ms Savita Dhaker, Assistant Commandant, CISF, was the Chief Guest for the Closing Ceremony.

OLYMPIAD EXAMINATIONS-Over 200 students took part in SOF Olympiads, while 10 participated in the Cyber Tech Olympiad and 5 in the Automobile Olympiad.

SCIENCE ACTIVITIES-The Science Department organised a Mini Exhibition on National Science Day 2025, featuring working models and innovative ideas by Classes 6–8 and our students attended the National Science Day 2025 Outreach Programme at IIST Trivandrum.

Four students—Paarth Rampal and Adithya A.R. of Class 11, and Rithwika J. Nair and Ananya Nelabhotla of Class 10—participated in the State-level INSPIRE MANAK Project Display at Kannur.

NATIONAL SPACE DAY -VSSC Central School conducted week-long National Space Day events in August 2025 with the theme “Aryabhatta to Gaganyaan: Ancient Wisdom to Infinite Possibilities.” The celebrations included competitions like painting, essay writing, quizzes, science-fiction, seminars, astrophotography, literary appreciation, skits, rallies, a science exhibition, rocket and space-station model making, interschool talks, and a science excursion. The events culminated in a valedictory function addressed by Dr. Abhilash Mony, Scientist/Engineer-SFC, IISU, and the prizes were awarded on Children’s Day.

CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CCA-The academic year 2025–26 offered diverse co-curricular activities that nurtured creativity, teamwork, and leadership from Balvatika-3 to Class 12, and winners were honoured during the Children’s Day 2025 celebration.

SCHOOL MAGAZINE-The school released its biennial magazine *Antariksh* 2023–25 in September 2025, highlighting major activities, achievements, and creative works of students and teachers.

NEW FACILITIES-Sixteen classrooms were upgraded with interactive panels, enhancing digital learning and classroom engagement. The newly inaugurated children's park and the refurbished school auditorium have further enriched the school's recreational and cultural facilities.

EXTRA COACHING-The school provides extra coaching in band and badminton after school hours, led by expert coaches to help students enhance their skills.
