a) Balvatika III admission

The number of vacancies for the academic year 2025-'26 is 40 and the admission is as per the following admission priorities. Children of VSSC /IISU /LPSC / IIST employees residing in ISRO quarters.

- Children of CISF personnel of these centres residing in ISRO quarters.
- 2. Children of VSSC /IISU /LPSC / IIST employees residing outside quarters.
- Children of CISF personnel of these centres residing outside quarters.
- 4. Grandchildren of serving/ retired employees of ISRO/CISF.

b) Class I admission

The number of vacancies for the academic year 2025-'26 is 60. These 60 seats are released as per the following admission priorities.

- 1. Children of VSSC /IISU /LPSC / IIST employees residing in ISRO guarters.
- 2. Children of CISF personnel of these centres residing in ISRO quarters.

- 3. Children of VSSC /IISU /LPSC / IIST employees residing outside guarters.
- 4. Children of CISF personnel of these centres residing outside quarters.
- 5. Grandchildren of serving/ retired employees of ISRO/CISF.

c) Class XI admission

The seats of Class XI admission are released as per the eligibility criteria mentioned in the admission circular for the following admission priorities.

PHYSICAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION

Physical and Health Education is of vital importance for everyone. Good health is a pre-requisite for a person's efficiency in everything. Health Education is linked with Physical Education. Its principles and problems are included in the School Curriculum to make the students aware of the factors affecting health and the maintenance of health.

ART AND MUSIC EDUCATION

Art and Music are indispensable means for the merging of the individual with the whole. Through these art forms the individual not only identifies with what he is not, he/she also gains distance from it. Creation of a work of art involves experience, the transformation of experience to memory and memories into expression. Music helps the individual to transcend from the mundane to the sublime. ASSESSMENT

- The Assessment criteria for classes 9 to 12 is based on circular no. Acad-11/2019 issued by the CBSE dated on March 6, 2019.
- The same criteria will be applied to Classes 3 to 8 till further notification is received from the Board.
- A Student has to secure a minimum of 33% in both internal and term end assessment to be declared Pass.
- Balavatika-3 Classes 1 and 2 will not have formal examinations.
 Teachers will conduct it informally.
- For Classes 11 and 12 a student has to secure a minimum of 33% in both internal and term end assessment separately to be declared pass.

A student who does not pay on the due date will have to pay fine of a consolidated amount Rs.500/- each (for Tuition Fee and VVN separately) till the stipulated date/s, after which the name of the defaulter will be struck off from the rolls of the school. He/she will be readmitted on payment of the full dues. Readmission is not automatic. It is subject to availability of vacancies.

The collection of the VVN will be made annually and tuition fees in the month of June and October. Both Tuition Fee and VVN Fee are collected for 12 months.

Fees from grand children and employees, other than employees of VSSC, shall be collected at the beginning of the academic year as lump sum in advance.

Computer Science Fee is payable along with the Tuition Fee.

CONCESSION

The following categories of students studying in classes IX to XII of the school are given the concession as mentioned below.

- Children belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe communities and children admitted under the RTE Act 2009 are exempted from paying Tuition Fees.
- Girl students are exempted from paying Tuition Fees and Computer Science Fees.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1. All students of Std. VI to XII may borrow books. Students of classes I to V will have class library periods.
- 2. Students may choose books from the shelves. They must take the books to the Librarian before checking out.
- 3. A student can borrow one book at a time for a period of two weeks.
- 4. A staff member can *borrow* three books at a time for a period of one month.
- 5. Books will be issued to the students, during the library periods. No book will be issued or returned during the teaching hours.
- 6. Marking, underlining or writing on library books, periodicals and newspapers is strictly forbidden.
- 7. Reference books and current periodicals will not be issued to any member. These can be consulted only in library.
- 8. If the books are not returned within the specified time it will be viewed seriously and fine will be charged as per rule.
- 9. The Librarian may call for a book at anytime, even if the normal period of loan has not expired.
- In case of book is misused, wrongly handled or lost the person concerned will have to replace it or pay for it a fine fixed by the Librarian.
- 11. After reading, make sure that the books, periodicals and newspapers are kept back at their respective places.
- 12. The members should take good care of library furnishings and equipment. Make sure the library looks as good when you leave as it did when you came in.
- 13. Drink and food are not allowed in the library.
- 14. Library computers are for academic purpose only. Do not tamper with the computer settings.
- 15. A, 'No due certificate' by each student is to be obtained from the Librarian while his/her transfer or withdrawal from the school.
- 16. Perfect silence shall be maintained in the library.
- 17. A record of book read should be maintained by the student.
- 18. School bags and hand bags cannot be carried inside the library.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

It is compulsory that all students should come to school in the prescribed uniform, as detailed below.

PS: Boys are not allowed to wear pants with low waist. They are expected to have short hair-cut, decent hair style with the hairline well above the shirt collar and a clean shaven face.

SCHOOL BUS

Six buses of the Department are operated in six different routes on all working days. Parents may note and adhere to the following:

- 1. In order to avail the school bus facilities, the parent has to submit the duly filled application form along with online fee receipt.
- 2. Mode of remittance is online.
- 3. The bus fee shall be paid in advance only by yearly installments.
- 4. The fee paid shall not be refunded due to withdrawal of bus facility by own volition.
- 5. Detailed boarding point wise fee will be displayed in School Notice Boards and in School website.
- 6. No change in routes or inclusion of new stops will be entertained after 30th June every year.
- 7. School buses will not be operated on days of bandh or hartal and the like.

- In case of unforeseen circumstances and other exigencies which
 necessitate changes in bus routes or bus timings, parents must
 contact the school office/bus conductors or the school authorities
 for information and appropriate action to ensure the safety of their
 wards.
- School Buses will be operated and controlled by the school administration.

Bus fees will be accepted only in ONLINE mode and to be paid ANNUALLY

LEAVE RULES

No student shall absent himself/herself from school on any days or part there of without the written permission of the Class teacher and Principal.

When absence is unavoidable a written request must be made in advance by the parent.

In case a student absents himself/herself for more than 15 working days without obtaining leave, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls. Re-admission will be done only on payment of all dues, fines and re-admission fees.

Students who suffer from infectious diseases should absent themselves from attending classes. After recovery they should produce a fitness certificate from a Medical Officer.

CERTIFICATES

Parents who require various certificates like Character and Conduct Certificate, Date of Birth Certificate, Transfer Certificate, Study Certificate etc. should give an application in writing at least three working days in advance during the middle of the session and at least seven days in advance at the time of closing and re-opening of the school.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Students should be habitually clean and neatly dressed. No student should come to school without the school uniform, except on permitted occasion.
- 2. Punctuality is the key to success. Students should be punctual and be in their seats before the bell rings for attendance.
- After attendance is marked they will proceed to the Assembly Hall in a single line. All should join the school prayer. After the Assembly they will return to their respective classes in an orderly manner.
- 4. Every pupil shall pay respect to the Teachers while meeting them within the school premises and outside.
- 5. School property should be treated with due respect and should not be damaged. Suitable punishment shall be awarded to those who damage furniture besides making good the loss from parents /students. Any damage of the school property shall be reported to the teachers, even if he/she does not know who has done it.
- Scratching on School furniture, writing or drawing lines etc. on walls and misusing school materials, speak of bad habit and will be viewed seriously.
 It must be avoided with utmost care.
- 7. They should switch off fan & light points while going out of the classroom.
- 8. Students should observe basic toilet manners.
- Noise is the greatest enemy of the students. Silence encourages smooth working, sound understanding and healthy saving of time and energy. It should be maintained and practised with great care at all times.
- 10. No pupil shall disturb other classes at work on the flimsy pleas like getting the loan of pencils, pen or books etc. from any of his/her friend.
- Diary and progress card should be submitted to the parent and teacher to give timely information of the working, progress, deficiencies and remedial measures adopted.
- 12. Every student should compulsorily bring his/her Students' Diary to school and make appropriate use of it daily. A student without diary can attend classes only with the permission of the Principal/ Class teacher.

- 13. Money should not be lent or borrowed or articles exchanged. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuables (like watches, pens or ornaments).
- 14. A student should not leave the campus during school hours without the permission of the Principal/ Class teacher.
- 15. Students should not bring to the school undesirable books, notes, pictures or magazines and any electronic gadgets.
- 16. Bicycles must be kept locked in the Bicycle stand.
- 17. Students suffering from a contagious or infectious disease should not attend the class and should submit the fitness certificate at the time of joining.
- 18. Students should always behave in a courteous and civilised manner wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
- 19. Students are not allowed to use or bring mobile phone inside the school. Students found in possession of items like CDs, Camera, USB, Smart watch and any such items are liable for punishment and confiscation of the item.

ACTS OF MISCONDUCT

- a) The following acts and conduct on the part of the students will amount to miscounduct:
- (i) Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employees of the school.
- (ii) Intentional disturbances of classes.
- (iii) Absence from classes without the permission of the Teacher.
- (iv) Bullying/Intimidation of others.
- (v) Teasing/misbehaviour.
- (vi) Damaging/disfiguring school property.
- (vii) Indulging in physical violence in any manner.
- (viii) Disobeying lawful instructions of the teachers.
- (ix) Bringing unauthorized people/articles inside the school.
- (x) Theft/pilferage of school/student's property.

- (xi) Any behaviour unbecoming of a student.
- (xii) Indulging in acts of moral turpitude.
- (b) In case of misconduct, Principal shall take suitable action as per observation of the school disciplinary committee depending on the gravity of the misconduct which may include:
- (i) Oral/Written warning to the student and parents.
- (ii) Suspension from attending classes/school for a specified period.
- (iii) Recovery of loss to school property (If the misconduct amounts to loss/ damage to School property, the damaged/lost item has to be replaced by concerned parent or pay a fine of double the amount of the damaged/ lost item).
- (iv) Issue of Transfer Certificate with appropriate remarks.
- (v) Expulsion from school.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS

It is an established fact that education begins at home. The first teacher of a child is his parent. Any effort made by the teachers will bear fruit only if the parents extend their full co-operation in every field of education. Hence maximum active co-operation between the home and the school is earnestly sought.

Parents/ Guardians are requested:

- (a) To provide their children/wards with proper uniform, text books, note books, pen, pencils etc. throughout the session. It may be noted that laboratory coats, goggles and gloves also be provided for students of class IX and above while using the Chemistry lab.
- (b) To look in to the child's diary and to see that the lesson and home assignments for the next day are done by the children under their supervision.
- (c) To see that the record of home work and progress report are signed after checking the work.
- (d) To ensure that the fees are remitted on time.
- (e) To ensure that their ward brings text books, note books and other materials to school according to the time table only.

- (f) To discourage their wards from bringing plastic carry bags to school as plastic bags are hazardous to health as well as environment.
- (g) To ensure that their wards do not use or bring mobile phones, CD's, Cameras and other electronic gadgets to school.
- (h) To encourage their ward/s to participate in Co-curricular activities-Cultural, Literary, Artistic, Sports, Games and NCC.
- (i) To send the application for leave of their ward /s on time. And not send children to school when they are ill.
- (j) To go through the instructions thoroughly so that active co-operation may be had in dealing with problems to the best satisfaction in the most dignified way.
- (k) To note the occasional reports from the teacher or Principal entered in the student's diary from time to time and to sign it. Failure to do so may put the child to inconvenience.
- Not to visit their ward/s or their teachers when class is in progress, except in case of exigencies.
- (m) To come and discuss your views, if any, on problems connected with your wards with the Principal.
- (n) To meet their wards through the Principal only. A parent visiting the school to meet a teacher during working hours should fill a format and get it signed by Principal/ Vice Principal before meeting the teacher. The format is available in the office.
- (o) To refrain from calling their wards on telephone during class hours, except in case of exigencies.
- (p) Not to send anyone else to collect their ward/s during school hours. To come personally and meet the Principal in case of emergencies.
- (q) To scrupulously avoid criticism of a teacher or the school in the presence of the child. If the parent has a legitimate complaint he/she may see the Principal or use the suggestion box.
- (r) To ensure that their ward attends slow learners programme.

We, the people of India, HAVING SOLEMNLY RESOLVED TO CONSTITUTE India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE - Social, economic and political.

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship:

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty - sixth day of November, 1949, do hereby ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

- (d) To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so:
- (e) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women:
- (f) To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture:
- (g) To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creatures:
- (h) To develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform
- (i) To safeguard public property and abjure violence:
- (j) To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises higher levels of endeavour and achievement.
